

# Career Tech Matters

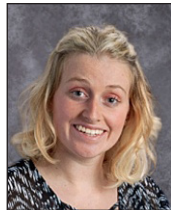

Yesterday, we initiated another aspect of our GRIT program with an assembly that recognized students for exceeding the expectations of the program.

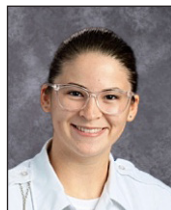
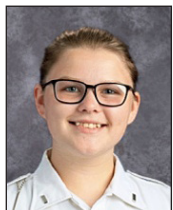
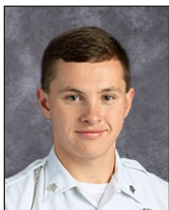
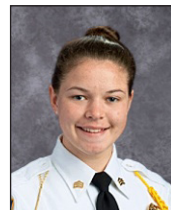
