Other activities planned for the morning are story time, crafts, face painting and an egg toss. In addition, children will get to see bunnies, fainting goats and young chickens.

"This is all about giving back to the commu-



nity," Katie said. "The kids loved the idea."

Upon completion of the EGGstravaganza, the 15-member Student Council will turn their attention to the prom, scheduled for 6 p.m. May 11.

Council members will turn the front campus into a vintage circus with the theme Under the Big Top. Prom will be held outside and tents have been rented.

Katie said the idea stemmed from the popularity of the movie *The Greatest Showman* and the students liked the style of the costumes in the movie.

Naturally, if it's a circus there must be circus food, so popcorn, cotton candy and other snacks will be available.

This year's prom won't include a full dinner and Katie said ticket prices would reflect that.

"In past years, our prom space was either too small or too hot or both," Katie said. "We hope the theme, being outside and holding it in mid-May will help us avoid those issues."
