Regular Board Meeting

March 24, 2022

Opening

The Pickaway-Ross JVSD Board of Education met in Regular Session on Thursday, March 24, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Conference Room at the Pickaway-Ross Career & Technology Center, 895 Crouse Chapel Road, Chillicothe, Ohio with Byron Lloyd, presiding. The Board adopted the Agenda, as finalized.
